November Club Meeting

The club lunch meeting was held at 6 Mile Chop House on Nov. 19, with 9 club members and one guest (Greg Inkman) in attendance. Scott Stordahl called the meeting to order around 12:50 p.m. He started by going over the 2023 schedule of JMM events (see front page).



Treasurer Jim Morris was absent so Scott went over the treasurer's report. We had \$505.62 in income from raffle, dues, and a contribution in memory of Gary Rauckman. Expenses were \$218.99 for supplies needed for the work table replacement. We ended the month with a net worth of \$6,316.40.



Scott announced that the Rauckman family is donating Gary's seed spreader to the club, with the stipulation that they be able to use it if they ever need to. It will be stored in the shed at the field.

Safety Officer Glenn Minor reminded us that we have 2 fire extinguishers in the shed that are available during club events. He also mentioned that we should call 911 for any grass fires. Scott added that, per AMA requirements, turbine operations at the field require a BC fire extinguisher and a bucket with 5 gallons of water.

Scott said he only had 2 entries for the logo contest so far and encouraged all to submit designs.

Scott also said that his poll of members' opinions on whether they preferred pavement on the E-W or the alternate N-S runway was split exactly 50-50! So no help with any decision.

Current officers described their term limits, meaning that at a minimum, we need a **new safety officer, treasurer, and at-large board member.** ***Elections will be held at the December meeting!*** We will be

raffling off a Spektrum transmitter to encourage attendance.

Locations for the "Fly In the New Year" New Year's Eve Night Fly and the New year's Day Freeze Fly were discussed with Greg Inkman. The upshot is that they will both be at our field again this year.

The young man mentioned in last month's newsletter who'd been hit by a car is out of the hospital but still faces a long recovery. We are following his progress on Caring Bridge, and hope to present him with a ready-to-fly model and offer lessons when he is up to it.

Scott next brought up our need for another CD (contest director) in the club. Without Gary R., we only have 2 AMA-approved CDs, Scott and Patrick. Since Patrick is also CD for the Blue Sky club, we are effectively down to 1 and a half CDs. This comes at a time when we are now scheduling 5 club events per year. The procedure for becoming a CD is not difficult, so please consider applying for CD status to help the club put on our events.

Show & Tell: Mike Weinsaft showed us his homemade battery discharger, intended primarily to fully discharge damaged or obsolete LiPo battery packs. Scott talked about how cool the new version of Microsoft Flight Simulator is on Xbox, with realistic scenery from basically anywhere.

December Safety Tips

It's that time of year again as we try to find balance between safely enjoying our hobby and staying warm at the field.

Bulky or loose fitting jackets, scarfs and gloves pose a snag hazard when we're in the flight pits.

Here are a few suggestions for making things a little safer when we fly:



Consider a neck warmer as an alternative to the traditional scarf. These are inexpensive and may even be warmer since they can be more secure than a scarf.



For jackets, when flying, consider a cuff style sleeve (if you own one) that all but eliminates loose fabric around your hands and spinning props.



For gloves, consider purchasing a pair with grip dots or just temporarily remove your gloves while priming engines and carrying planes to the runway. Glenn

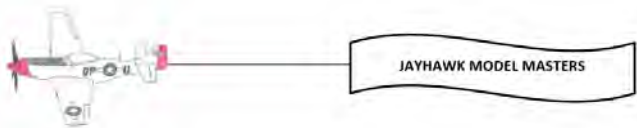
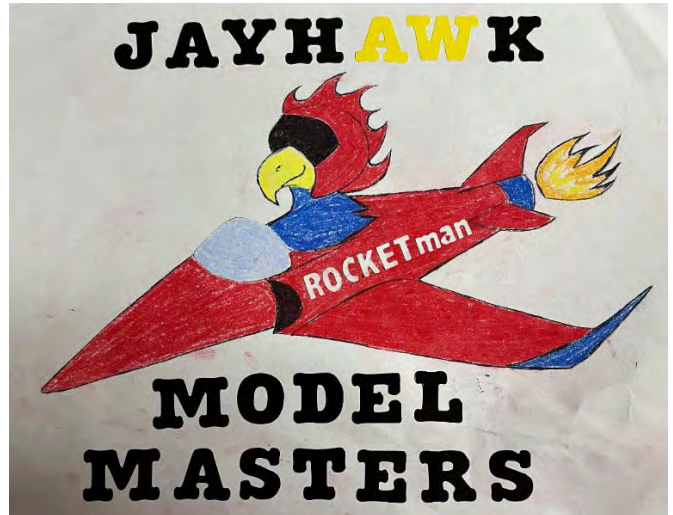
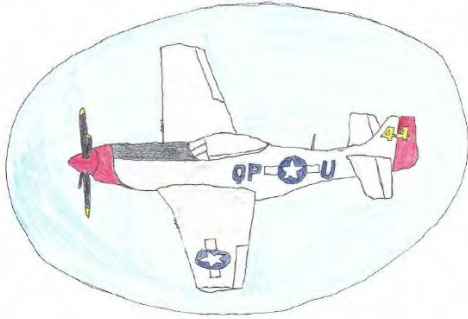
